 <b>KEY CATALYTIC PROJECTS</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Vegetables:</b> investment in the Jozini Value Add Centre will further develop its capacity to process vegetables, create a market for smallholder primary producers in the district and provide an opportunity for private sector investment and partnering</li> <li><b>Livestock:</b> implementation of the district's livestock production plan will boost production to levels required for sufficient throughput to the abattoir to make it a viable and sustainable operation while creating a potential market for smallholder livestock farmers found north of the FMD 'red line'</li> <li><b>Cotton:</b> investment in primary production, through Ubongwa Cotton and its affiliated cooperatives, is required to provide sufficient throughput to the Cotton gin to make it a viable and sustainable operation</li> </ul>	 <b>AGRO-PROCESSING BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Vegetables:</b> there is little scope for large scale agro-processing but opportunity exists for primary value-adding practices such as pre-packing and slicing. Additionally, if the livestock production plan is successfully implemented, the Agri-Park's abattoir will have the potential for an annual throughput of up to <b>3 406t (13 200 animals)</b></li> <li><b>Job creation estimates:</b> successful implementation of projects across the 3 commodities will create an estimated <b>4 042 – 6 028</b> employment opportunities in the UKDM Agri-Park</li> <li><b>Smallholder farmers:</b> of these employment opportunities, approximately <b>3 093 – 4 618</b> will be on-farm opportunities for smallholder farmers</li> <li><b>FPSU &amp; AH:</b> approximately <b>949 – 1 411</b> employment opportunities are estimated to be created upstream (FPSU) and downstream (AH) of primary production activities</li> </ul>
